

Thomas Buckley is Senior Deputy Chief in the Federal Communication Commission's Telecommunications Access Policy Division. Mr. Buckley's duties include, among other things, the management of the Universal Service Rural Health Care Pilot Program which was established by the Commission to facilitate the creation of a nationwide broadband network dedicated to health care by providing up to 85 percent of the network deployment costs to connect health care providers in rural and urban areas throughout the Nation.

Prior to that, Mr. Buckley served as Legal Counsel to the Chief of the FCC's Wireline Competition Bureau and an Attorney-Advisor in the Bureau. Before he joined the Commission, Mr. Buckley was an associate in the communications group at the law firm of Reed Smith, LLP.

Mr. Buckley holds a Juris Doctor degree from the Catholic University of America's Columbus School of Law and holds a certificate from their Institute for Communications Law Studies. While at the Columbus School of Law, Mr. Buckley also served as Editor-in-Chief of the *CommLaw Conspectus: Journal of Communications Law and Policy*.
